The Sign of the Cross In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Lighting a candle As I light this candle, I remember those who I have loved and who have died. I remember especially (Name...).

(Light a candle and then pause to pray for & remember your deceased loved ones) Jesus you said, I am the light of the world. May your light shine on N. ... and all those who have died. May they be bathed always in the light of your love and grace, and come to eternal life with you. Amen.

God's Consoling Word	After each bible verse pause to let God's word speak to you

Prayer O Lord of life and hope, as I stand at this grave I remember with love (Name...). (pause) Thank You for the gift of them in my life.

I have been truly blessed by their presence,

their words and actions, and their love.

The pain of their loss is a reminder of the depth of the bond we shared.

Give me the strength and courage to leave them in your care.

Help me, O God, to realize that the distance between us now is not so great and that one day, I will be reunited with them in heaven, sharing in Your promise of eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
