2025



Synod 2021-2024: For a synodal Church: communion, participation and mission

In October 2021 the Catholic Church's synodal process on the theme of 'synodality' began. This was the first time that a worldwide listening process and consultation with parishes and dioceses was attempted and many people in our diocese took part in a listening process during the early months of 2022. The following is a reference to the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Final Document of the recent Universal Synod in Rome. We look forward to hearing more about the Synodal Process in the Irish context during the coming months.

'The Sacrament of Confirmation enriches the lives of believers with a special outpouring of the Spirit so that they become witnesses to faith. This sanctifying anointment seals their belonging to God. It renews in us the miracle of a Church stirred up by the fire of mission, with the courage to go out onto the streets of the world with the ability to be understood by all the peoples and cultures'

Theme for Confirmation 2025

"Without Him, I can do nothing" (Jn. 15:5)

Inspired by Blessed Carlo Acutis and aligned with the Jubilee Year of Hope, this theme highlights dependence on Christ as the source of hope and faith. It also complements the Synodal Pathway encouraging unity, reflection, and a journey of faith shared as a community.

(Please note: As Bl. Carlo Acutis is to be canonised on April 27th 2025 at confirmation ceremonies taking place after this date he should be referred to as Saint Carlo Acutis)

These Guidelines are designed to help parishes, particularly those where Bishop Denis will preside, in their preparation and planning of the celebration of Confirmation.

They will also help Bishop Denis in his preparation for the celebration in each parish.

It would be very helpful if parishes where Bishop Denis is not presiding at

Confirmation this year would, by emailing <u>aisling@kandle.ie</u>, let him know when their celebration is and how many candidates are being confirmed. It is hoped that these guidelines will also be of use in those parishes.

CELEBRATING THE RITE OF CONFIRMATION:

We continue to acknowledge that Confirmation celebrations may take place outside of Mass as allowed by Canon 882. However, where possible, Bishop Denis asks that Confirmation should be celebrated within the Eucharist.

CONFIRMATION BOOKLETS:

Parishes and schools are asked to consider carefully the environmental impact of printing booklets. If your parish is preparing a booklet for use on the day, please send a copy to Bishop Denis in advance.

BEFORE THE CELEBRATION TAKES PLACE: Bishop Denis asks that the relevant Confirmation Planning Form

be completed and returned to the Diocesan Office <u>at least three weeks before the</u> <u>date of Confirmation in your parish.</u>

The following notes are designed to help ensure the best possible experience of the celebration of Confirmation for all.

1: PARISH PREPARATION: Bishop Denis would like a brief description of the type of preparation undertaken by the candidates and their families in the parish. This can be as simple as naming the preparation programme such as You Shall Be My Witnesses, We Belong to Christ or providing an outline of any initiatives used by the parish team to engage the candidates and their families in a programme of preparation in the months prior to

Confirmation. This will enable him to encourage and affirm the work of preparation in the parish during the ceremony.

2: LETTER TO THE BISHOP:

Bishop Denis would like all candidates who will be confirmed by him to submit a letter prior to Confirmation. This letter is to be written at home by the candidates in consultation with their parents/guardians and then signed by the candidates and their parents/guardians. The letters should then be sent by the parish to the bishop together with the enclosed form three weeks before the celebration of Confirmation in your parish. If your parish has multiple confirmations please ensure that the letters are bundled together and labelled with the names of schools and the corresponding Confirmation Ceremony. The following information should be included in the letters:

BIOGRAPHY: The candidate should introduce themselves to Bishop Denis using some of the following information:

Their name and age

The name of their school and the class that they are in

The name of their parish

Something about their family

Their interests/hobbies/favourite things to do

DESCRIPTION OF PREPARATION AT HOME, IN THE PARISH AND IN SCHOOL: The candidate needs to say something to the bishop about how he or she has prepared to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation.

PERSONAL MEANING: The candidate should reflect on what the celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation means to them.

CONFIRMATION NAME AND SPONSOR: The candidate should tell the bishop what name they are choosing and why. They might also say something about their sponsor and the reason for choosing this person.

FOR 2025:

The candidate should say something to the bishop about how they and their classmates have responded to the Confirmation Challenge set by Bishop Denis. The focus this year is on how the young candidates have lived the theme of "Without Him, I can do nothing" inspired by Blessed Carlo Acutis. Over the course of their confirmation preparation encourage candidates to consider:

- How they have recognised their dependence on Christ in their daily lives.
- What does Blessed Carlo Acutis' motto 'The Eucharist is my Highway to Heaven' mean to me in my life as a young person?
- Ways in which they might use their gifts to bring Christ's light to others, especially through modern and creative means, as Blessed Carlo did.

For this years' Confirmation Challenge Bishop Denis invites you to take on ONE of the following challenges

- **1. Eucharistic Adoration Visits:** Organise sessions where candidates can spend time in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, reflecting on Blessed Carlo's devotion to the Eucharist, recalling his words: "The Eucharist is my highway to heaven".
- **2. Random Acts of Kindness:** Recall Blessed Carlo's words: "A life will be really beautiful if we arrive to love God above all things and our neighbour as ourselves".

Brainstorm what Random Acts of Kindness the children might perform at home, in school, in the parish and in the community. Ask the children to write the ideas on cards then collect the cards and place them in the sacred space. Invite the children to pick a card every morning and perform the Act of Kindness that day.

3. Sharing our Faith: Blessed Carol's words: "Everyone is born as an original, but many people end up dying as photocopies".

How do we experience our dependence on Christ in daily life? Arrange small group discussions where pupils can share examples of their own experience. Have the children write some of their examples on post it notes, collect the notes and display on a poster in the Sacred Space under the heading 'Without Him I can do Nothing'

- **4. Recall Blessed Carlo Acutis' words:** "Everything passes away ... what alone will truly make us beautiful in God's eyes is the way that we have loved him and our brothers". Plan activities such as helping in the parish, visiting the elderly, fundraising for charity organising or supporting parish events to live out their call to serve others in Christ's name
- **5. Digital Presentation:** Recall Blessed Carlo's words: "God has written for each one of us a unique and unrepeatable story, but he has left us the freedom to write the conclusion". Have candidates research and present on Blessed Carlo's life and how his message applies to their modern-day context.

3: SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

The sacrament of reconciliation should be celebrated by all candidates prior to the celebration of Confirmation. A suggested outline for a Reconciliation Service and for a combined Reconciliation and Ceremony of Light Service is available for download on www.kandle.ie

- **4: RETREAT:** Many parishes provide candidates with the opportunity of a retreat before or after Confirmation.
- **5: SPONSORS:** Each candidate has a sponsor for confirmation. The sponsor for any candidate may be male or female, is to be at least 16 years of age, a fully initiated Catholic and living a life of faith which befits the role to be undertaken. A parent may not act as a sponsor for his or her child (Canon 874). A Baptismal sponsor is desired as the Confirmation sponsor, in order to emphasize the relationship between Baptism and Confirmation (Canon 893.2).
- **6: PLEDGE:** The Pledge Commitment is an important part of the candidate's preparation. All parishes are expected to include a Pledge Commitment Ceremony outside of the Confirmation Ceremony as part of the preparation of the post celebration process.

7: DAY OF CELEBRATION

ATTIRE: To make visible the relationship between confirmation and baptism, many parishes encourage the wearing of albs. This also helps to alleviate some of the costs associated with Confirmation.

PHOTOGRAPHY AND VIDEOGRAPHY: Under the Diocesan Safeguarding Guidelines best practice would suggest that no photography or videography should take place in the Church. Therefore, the taking of photographs and of videos is not permitted during the ceremony and this must be communicated to candidates, parents/guardians, sponsors and family members prior to the celebration of Confirmation. This can be done at the **rehearsal and on the day** itself in the time before the liturgy begins. The turning off of mobile phones should also be requested at this time.

Stewards can help to ensure that the taking of photographs or videos is discouraged.

Bishop Denis suggests that a group picture of him with the candidates be taken after the ceremony and that the organisation of this should be done at Confirmation.

If a videographer is being used in an official capacity, he/she should be instructed not to distract from the solemn nature of the celebration and at no time should he/she enter the sanctuary area. Parental consent for the taking of the video must also be obtained from all parents in advance of the ceremony.

8: LITURGICAL GUIDELINES FOR CONFIRMATION WITHIN MASS

PRELUDE: Five minutes before the Confirmation ceremony begins it is useful for the

priest or other nominated person to begin preparing the congregation for the celebration

which is to follow. This is an opportunity to quieten the gathering, remind them of the need

to switch off mobile phones, not to take pictures and to invite them to spend a moment in

quiet prayer for the candidates who are to be confirmed. This may be accompanied by some

quiet instrumental music that can continue until the liturgy is ready to begin.

INTRODUCTORY RITES:

ENTRANCE SONG: The Entrance Song should be one that is familiar to the children and if

possible to members of the congregation. Consider having a cantor who invites and

encourages everyone to sing.

ENTRANCE PROCESSION: The following is the order of the Entrance Procession

Incense Bearer (thurifer) with burning incense

Cross Bearer with the Processional Cross

2 Candle-Bearers

Candidates and Sponsors (optional)

Reader (optional)

Deacon (if present)

Concelebrants

Bishop with mitre and crozier

Mitre and crozier bearers

The reader or deacon may carry the Book of the Gospels in the Entrance Procession. This is

particularly appropriate if there is to be a Gospel Procession.

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CONFIRMATION CHALLENGE 2025

The Candidate/s who have been chosen by their classmates to tell Bishop Denis about the way in which they have responded to the Challenge might be invited to do so now. Allow the bishop to take his place, greet the people and say his opening words before this takes place. Alternatively this could be done after Communion and before the final song.

Please Note: There should be no procession of symbols if this is taking place at the beginning of the Confirmation Ceremony.

PROCESSION OF SYMBOLS

If there is to be a procession of symbols during the Confirmation Ceremony, it should take place after the Entrance Procession. Allow the bishop to take his place, greet the people and say his opening words before this procession takes place. The symbols, representing the candidate's faith-filled lives in home, school and parish, do not have to be presented to the bishop but should be brought to the sanctuary and placed in an appropriate place.

PENITENTIAL ACT

The Sprinkling Rite is to be used when Confirmation is celebrated on a Sunday or on any day during the Easter Season. (Appendix II New Roman Missal p.1353)

When used THE KYRIE will be intoned by Bishop Denis (A Thiarna déan Trócaire: O'Riada Mass)
The following parts of the Mass from the Glendalough Mass by Liam Lawton are to be sung.
Parishes may also use Liam Lawton's Mass of St Patrick available from www.giamusic.com

• Alleluia

In Lent, this is to be replaced by: Glory and praise, glory and praise, Lord Jesus Christ (x2)

- Sanctus
- Memorial Acclamation (Bishop Denis will intone this)
- The Great Amen (Bishop Denis will sing the Doxology)
- Agnus Dei

GLORIA: Where possible the Gloria should be sung. (The Gloria is not prayed where Confirmation takes place during the Lenten Season)

LITURGY OF THE WORD:

Consider inviting a Minister of the Word or a parent/older sibling to proclaim the readings.

This allows the candidates to concentrate on their role which is to celebrate the sacrament

and not to be distracted by participating in ways that might be best left to those who are

already ministers in the community. This also allows for the community of faith to minister

candidates on the day rather than the other way round.

FIRST READING: Colossians 2: 5-10 (Text on page 17)

PSALM: Ideally the psalm should be sung. Consider using Psalm 103 Send Forth your Spirit O

Lord (Liam Lawton)

or

Psalm 23 My Shepherd is the Lord (Alive O - Jack Miffleton)

GOSPEL GREETING (Sung) A gospel procession may take place. If this happens repeat the

Alleluia/Glory and Praise until the deacon or priest reaches the ambo.

GOSPEL: John 15:8-17 (Text on page 17)

HOMILY

RITE OF CONFIRMATION

A cantor or choir may sing a suitable hymn for the procession of the candidates to

the bishop. An instrumental piece may also be used. Ideally music or song should

accompany the whole of the Anointing with Chrism.

LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST:

Presentation Of The Gifts:

A suitable hymn may be sung, or an instrumental piece may be played at this time. Preparation of the altar may be done by family members of some of the candidates. This allows for the presentation of the gifts of bread and wine to be highlighted as they are the last items to be brought to the altar.

THE CONCLUDING RITES

Bishop Denis will pray a Solemn Blessing. A suitable hymn will be sung as the procession leaves the church.

CELEBRATION OF THE RITE OF CONFIRMATION

CAN. 881 It is desirable to celebrate the sacrament of confirmation in a church and during Mass; for a just and reasonable cause, however, it can be celebrated outside Mass and in any worthy place. Whenever Confirmation is conferred without Mass, a celebration of the word of God should precede it. [OC 13]

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION

PRESENTATION OF THE CANDIDATES

The names of the candidates are called, and they stand as they are presented to the Presider and the community alternatively see the suggestion for the Renewal of Baptismal Promises where the candidate's names might also be called.

HOMILY

RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL PROMISES

If baptismal candles are to be lit the priest could introduce the Renewal of Baptismal Promises in these or similar words while standing near the Paschal Candle

Our Paschal Candle is a sign of hope for all who believe that Jesus is the light of the world, a light that can never be quenched, a light that will always brighten our way. On the day of your baptism your parents took light from the Paschal Candle to light your baptismal candle as a sign of the faith that they wanted to pass on to you. They were asked to keep the light burning brightly until you were ready to say yes to your faith for yourselves. They obviously have done a good job because you are here, ready to confirm what they did for you at baptism, ready to say yes to continuing to live as Jesus wants you to. Now as they light your baptismal candle again, we pray that you will continue to walk as a child of the light and keep this light of faith burning brightly for all to see and that you will indeed, let your light

shine always inspired by the life and example of Blessed Carlo Acutis, during this Jubilee Year of Hope.

Each candidate and their parent/s are called forward individually, they light their baptismal candle and then return to their seats and remain standing

CELEBRANT: Do you renounce Satan,

And all his works,

And all his empty show?

CANDIDATES: I do.

CELEBRANT: Do you believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and

earth?

CANDIDATES: I do.

CELEBRANT: Do you believe in Jesus Christ,

his only Son, our Lord,

who was born of the Virgin Mary,

was crucified, died, and was buried,

rose from the dead,

and is seated at the right hand of the Father?

CANDIDATES: I do.

CELEBRANT: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit,

the Lord, the giver of life,

who came upon the apostles at Pentecost

and today is given to you sacramentally in Confirmation?

CANDIDATES: I do.

CELEBRANT: Do you believe in the holy catholic Church,

the communion of saints,

the forgiveness of sins,

the resurrection of the body,

and life everlasting?

CANDIDATES: I do.

CELEBRANT: This is our faith.

This is the faith of the Church.

We are proud to profess it in Christ Jesus our Lord.

CANDIDATES: Amen.

LAYING ON OF HANDS

CELEBRANT: My dear friends,

in baptism God our Father

gave the new birth of eternal life

to his chosen sons and daughters.

Let us pray to our Father

that he will pour out the Holy Spirit

to strengthen his sons and daughters with his gifts

and anoint them to be more like Christ, the Son of God.

The celebrant(s) stretch out their hands over the candidates and pray:

All powerful God,

Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,

by water and the Holy Spirit

you freed your sons and daughters from sin

and gave them a new life.

Send your Holy Spirit upon them,

to be their helper and guide.

Give them the spirit of wisdom and understanding,

the spirit of right judgement and courage,

the spirit of knowledge and reverence.

Fill them with the spirit of wonder,

and awe in your presence.

We ask this through Christ our Lord, Amen.
